# Subject:-Appointment of Information Commissioners in the Central Information Commission.

The issue on this file relates to appointment of three Information Commissioners in the Central Information Commission.

#### **Rule Position**

1. As per section 12 (2) of the Act, the Central Information Commission shall consist of the Chief Information Commissioner and such number of Central Information Commissioners, **not exceeding ten**, as may be deemed necessary. At present, the Central Information Commission has Chief Information Commissioner and 7(seven) Information Commissioners.

2. Section 12 (3) of the Act stipulates that the Chief Information Commissioner and the Information Commissioners shall be appointed by the President on the recommendation of a Committee consisting of the following:-

- (i) the Prime Minister who shall be the Chairman of the Committee,
- (ii) the Leader of the Opposition in the Lok Sabha, and
- (iii) a Union Cabinet Minister to be nominated by the Prime Minister.

(Hon'ble Prime Minister had approved nomination of Union Finance Minister in the Selection Committee vide PMO ID note No.600/52/C/1/2015-ES-2 dated 28.08.2015).

The Act further explains that for the purpose of removal of doubts, it is hereby declared that where the Leader of the Opposition in the House of the People has not been recognized as such, the Leader of the single largest group in opposition of the Government in the House of the People shall be deemed to be the Leader of Opposition.

3. Section 12(6) of the RTI Act, 2005 mandates that "The Chief Information commissioner or an Information Commissioner shall not be a Member of Parliament or Member of the Legislature of any State or Union territory, as the case may be, or hold any other office of profit or connected with any political party or carrying on any business or pursuing any profession."

4. As per the past policy, the Chief Information Commissioner/Information Commissioners are selected through the process of advertisement, short listing by Search Committee and recommendations of Committee chaired by Prime Minister and thereafter appointed by the President.

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#### Background

5. In February 2014, the Govt. of India decided to fill up two posts of Information Commissioners in the CIC. At that time, the CIC had Chief Information Commissioner and 08 Information Commissioners.

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6. On 25.02.2014, DoPT invited applications of interested persons for the post of Information Commissioners in the CIC, the last date for receipt of applications was 25.03.2014. In response to this circular a total number of 293 applications were received.

7. The process of appointment of Information Commissioners was started but before the Selection Committee could meet, one of the Information Commissioners, Shri Rajiv Mathur was elevated to the post of CIC on 22.05.2014 making the strength of Information Commissioners seven.

8. A fresh advertisement was issued on 16.07.2014. It was mentioned that those who had applied against advertisement issued on 25.2.2014 need not apply afresh. In response to the circular dated 16.7.2014, 260 applications were received. Thus a **total 553 applications** were received in response to advertisements published on 25.2.2014 and 16.7.2014.

9. In the meanwhile, Shri Rajiv Mathur completed his tenure as Chief Information Commissioner and demitted the office on 22.8.2014. The Central Information Commission on 23.8.2014 was without a Chief Information Commissioner and had seven Information Commissioners.

10. Applications were invited from interested persons to fill up the post of Chief Information Commissioner through advertisement on 24.10.2014. A total of 203 applications were received by the last date i.e. 24.11.2014.

11. On 6<sup>th</sup> April, 2015, a writ Petition(C) 3386 was filed by R.K. Jain & ors. V/s Union of India in Public Interest before High Court of Delhi. The petitioner contended that the post of the Chief Information Commissioner as well as three posts of Central Information Commissioners are vacant from August, 2014 and prayed to the Hon'ble Court to direct the Union of India to forthwith and urgently prepare a shortlist of candidates for the position of CIC and 3 ICs and Immediately place the said shortlist before the high powered selection committee for final selection and appointment to be concluded in a time bound manner.

12. In response to High Court order dated 8.4.2015, the DoPT filed an Affidavit on 9.4.2015 requesting Hon'ble Court to dismiss the WP(C) 3366 in view of the fact that the steps have already been taken for filling up the vacancies of the posts of Chief Information Commissioner and Central Information Commissioners.

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13. The next date of hearing was fixed for 11.5.2015 with the direction that respondents shall report the Court the progress made.

14. A Status Note was filed on 7.5.2015 before the Hon'ble Court, in continuation of affidavit filed by the DoPT on 9.4.2015. Hon'ble Court was apprised that the Search Committee had met on 16.1.2015, 6.2.2015 and 27.4.2015 for shortlisting the applicants for the post(s) of Chief Information Commissioner and Central Information Commissioners.

15. The case was listed for 11.5.2015 but could not be argued because of strike of lawyers and the next date of hearing was fixed for 21.5.2015. Hon'ble Court was informed that appointments are at advance stage of finalisation. After hearing both the sides, the Hon'ble Court reserved its judgment on 21.05.2015.

16. Shri Vijai Sharma, the then IC was appointed as new Chief Information Commissioner and Shri Sudhir Bhargava was appointed as IC on 10.6.2015 and 11.6.2015 respectively. The strength of Central Information Commission on 11.6.2015 was – one Chief Information Commissioner and seven Information Commissioners.

17. The tenure of Shri Vijai Sharma, Chief Information Commissioner was upto 1.12.2015. It was decided in September 2015, to start the process of appointment of new Chief Information Commissioner and more (upto 3) Information Commissioners in the Central Information Commission, through the prevailing policy of advertisement, shortlisting etc..

18. Accordingly, a combined advertisement inviting applications for the post of Chief Information Commissioner and more (upto three) Information Commissioners was published on 9.9.2015. The last date for receiving the applications was 12.10.2015. A total of 341 applications were received out of which 11 applicants had applied only for the post of Chief Information Commissioner, 157 applicants had applied only for the post of Information Commissioner and 173 applicants had applied for both the posts of Chief Information Commissioner and Information Commissioner.

19. On 24.09.2015, Hon'ble Court re-notified the case W.P. No. 3386/2015. The Union of India apprised the Court that the Govt. has already appointed Shri Vijay Sharma(Ex-IC) as CIC on 10.6.2015 and Shri Sudhir Bhargava as IC on 11.6.2015. The Court was also apprised that since CIC is retiring on 1.12.2015, Union of India has decided to fill up that post and also to appoint some more ICs(up to 3) in the Commission. After hearing the arguments, Court reserved its order.

20. The Court in its order on 6.11.2015 directed that:-

(i) The selection process that has already been commenced vide Notifications dated 25.02.2014 and 16.07.2014 shall be finalized within six weeks from today and the three vacancies of Information Commissioners

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existing as of today shall be filled up amongst the 553 applications that were received in response to the said two notifications.

(ii) The selection process pursuant to the Circular dated 09.09.2015 shall be confined for selection and appointment of the Chief Information Commissioner in the vacancy that would arise w.e.f. 02.12.2015 and one Information Commissioner which is likely to arise w.e.f. 02.12.2015.

21. The Union of India decided to challenge the order of Court on point (i) of para 20 and comply with point (ii) of the said para. Accordingly, the Search Committee, as in para 24, met on 10.11.2015 and 16.11.2015 and shortlisted following two panels

(A) Panel 1 - for the post of Chief Information Commissioner:

- (i) Shri R. K. Mathur, Retired IAS (MT:77)
- (ii) Shri Arun Kumar Misra, Retired IAS (UP:76)
- (iii) Shri Basant Seth, Incumbent Information Commissioner since 1.3.2012

(B) Panel II - for the post of Information Commissioner (in case the existing Information Commissioner's name is recommended by the Selection Committee for the post of CIC):

- (i) Shri Bhim Sain Bassi, IPS (AGMUT:77)
- (ii) Shri Bimal Julka, Retired IAS (MP:79)
- (iii) Ms. Vijaya Moorthy, Retired IA&AS (78)

22. In response to notification dated 9.9.2015 and in pursuance of direction of Hon'ble High Court, the Govt. of India **appointed Shri R.K. Mathur as Chief Information Commissioner on 4.1.2016** from panel-I. The panel-II became infructious

23. As regards, selection of ICs, pursuant to decision of Hon'ble High Court, the Govt. had challenged the verdict of High Court, Delhi by way of SLP No. 34495/2015 in the Supreme Court.The case was heard on 8.1.2016. The Hon'ble Supreme Court ordered (formal order yet to be received) as under:

- (i) To fill up three posts of Information Commissioners in the Central Information Commission within six weeks.
- (ii) Three Information Commissioners to be selected from the persons who applied against advertisements dated 25.2.2014, 16.7.2014 (553 applicants) and 9.9.2015 (330 applicants) i.e. a total of 883 applicants.

The issue on this file relates to appointment of three Information Commissioners in the Central Information Commission. The Search Committee, on 19.1.2016, had shortlisted applicants in accordance with the Rule position and the directions dated 8.1.2016 of Hon'ble Supreme Court in SLP No.34495 / 2015 in the matter of Union Of India vs. R.K.Jain and others.

2. The Selection Committee, headed by Hon'ble Prime Minister and having Hon'ble Finance Minister and Shri Mallikarjuna Kharge, the Leader of Single Largest Party in Lok Sabha as Members was scheduled to meet on 9<sup>th</sup> February,2016 at 4.30 P.M. in 7, RCR for selection of Information Commissioners. Agenda Note alongwith meeting notice was delivered to the office of Shri Kharge at 9, Safdarjung Road on 2<sup>nd</sup> February,2016 (around 8 p.m.)

3. Shri Kharge vide his letter dated 3<sup>rd</sup> February,2016 addressed to MoS(PP) has expressed his inability to attend the said meeting fixed for 9<sup>th</sup> February,2016. He has stated that he was not aware of the bye-elections to the State Assembly, Zila Panchayat and Taluk Panchayat in Karnataka scheduled to be held during this period. He has requested to fix the meeting on any day during the ensuing Parliament Session

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4. In this connection it is mentioned that Hon'ble Supreme Court on 08.01.2016 in SLP No. 34495/2015 in the matter of Union Of India vs. R.K.Jain and others has directed that the three posts of Information Commissioners, currently vacant, be filled up within six weeks. The period of six weeks will expire on 19<sup>th</sup> February,2016.

5. Since the Budget Session of Parliament is likely to commence after 20<sup>th</sup> February only, the delay in appointment of Information Commissioners may lead to non-compliance of above directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court.

The Hon'ble High Court of Delhi, in its order dated 06.11.2015 in WP (C) No.3386/2015 filed by R.K. Jain and Others Vs. UOI, had directed that

- (i) The selection process that has already been commenced vide notifications dated 25.02.2014 and 16.07.2014 shall be finalized within six weeks from today and the three vacancies of Information Commissioners existing as of today shall be filled up amongst the 553 applications that were received in response to the said two notifications.
- (ii) The selection process pursuant to the Circular dated 09.09.2015 shall be confined for selection and appointment of the Chief Information Commissioner in the vacancy that would arise w.e.f. 02.12.2015 and one Information Commissioner which is likely to arise w.e.f. 02.12.2015.

2. The Union of India has decided to challenge the order on point No. (i) of the above direction by filing SLP No.34495 in the Hon'ble Supreme Court. The case was heard by Hon'ble Supreme Court on  $8^{th}$  January, 2016. Hon'ble Supreme Court order has been downloaded from the website. During the course of hearing held on  $8^{th}$  January, 2016, the Ld. Attorney General apprised the Hon'ble Supreme Court that the direction contained in paragraph -13 of the impugned order dated 06.11.2015 has since complied with. In so far as direction (i) contained in the afore mentioned paragraph, it was submitted that the candidates who had responded to the notifications dated 25.02.2014 and 16. 07.2014 were considered and Chief Information Commissioner and one Information Commissioner have since been appointed. There are still three vacancies of Information Commissioners.

3. It was prayed by the Ld. Attorney General that petitioner may be permitted six weeks time to fill up remaining three vacancies of Information Commissioners, out of the candidates who had responded to the notifications dated 25.02.2014, 16.07.2014 and 09.09.2015. The Hon'ble Supreme Court allowed the above Prayer and directed that needful be done within six weeks time from 8th January, 2016. <u>The period of six weeks expires on 19.02.2015. The</u> case has been listed for further consideration on 26.02.2016.

4. The meeting for selection of the Information Commissioners is scheduled to be held under the Chairmanship of Hon'ble Prime Minister on 09.02.2016 (Tuesday) at 4.30 PM at 7, Race Course Road, New Delhi. The agenda of the meeting has already been circulated to the Members of the Selection Committee.

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# Subject:-Appointment of Information Commissioners in the Central Information Commission.

In exercise of the powers conferred by sub section (1) of section 12 of Right to Information Act, 2005, the Central Government has constituted the Central Information Commission. As per sub section (2) of section 12 of the Act, the Commission shall consist of the Chief Information Commissioner and such number of Central Information Commissioners not exceeding ten, as may be deemed necessary. At present, there are seven Information Commissioners and a Chief Information Commissioner.

2. As per Section 12 (5) of the Act, the Chief Information Commissioner and Information Commissioners shall be persons of eminence in public life with wide knowledge and experience in law, science and technology, social service, management, journalism, mass media or administration and governance.

3. Every Information Commissioner shall hold office for a term of five years from the date on which he enters upon his office or till he attains the age of sixty-five years, whichever is earlier, and shall not be eligible for re-appointment as such Information Commissioner:

Provided that every Information Commissioner shall, on vacating his office under this sub-section be eligible for appointment as the Chief Information Commissioner in the manner specified in sub-section (3) of section 12:

4. According to sub-section (3) of Section 12 of the Act, the Chief Information Commissioner and the Information Commissioners shall be appointed by the President on the recommendation of a committee consisting of:

- i. the Prime Minister, who shall be the Chairperson of the committee;
- ii. the Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha ; and
- iii. a Union Cabinet Minister to be nominated by the Prime Minister.

5. Accordingly the Committee was constituted with the Prime Minister, as Chairperson, Shri Mallikarjun Kharge, Leader of the single largest Party in Opposition in the Lok Sabha and Shri Arun Jaitley, Minister of Finance.

6. It is pertinent to mention that the process for selection of Information Commissioners was initiated on 17.2.2014 with an advertisement on 25.02.2014. A total of 293 applications were received by the last date of 25.03.2014. The process of appointment of Information Commissioners was started but before the Selection Committee could meet, one of the Information Commissioners, Shri Rajiv Mathur was elevated to the post of Chief Information Commissioner on 22.05.2014 making the strength of Information Commissioners seven.

7. A fresh advertisement was issued on 16.07.2014. It was mentioned that those who had applied against advertisement issued on 25.2.2014 need not apply afresh. In response to the circular dated 16.7.2014, 260 applications were received. Thus a total of 553 applications were received for the post of Information Commissioners in response to advertisements published on 25.2.2014 and 16.7.2014.

8. In the meanwhile, a writ petition (C) 3386 was filed by R.K. Jain & Ors. v/s Union of India in Public Interest under Article 226 of the Constitution of India before High Court of Delhi. After hearing both the sides on 21.5.2015, the Hon'ble Court reserved the matter for orders. Meanwhile the process of selection initiated in February, 2014 was concluded with appointment of Mr. Vijai Sharma as Chief Information Commissioner on 10.06.2015 and Shri Sudhir Bhargava as Information Commissioner on 11.06.2015.

9. A fresh advertisement dated 09.09.2015 was issued inviting applications for the posts of Information Commissioners and Chief Information Commissioner. A total of 341 applications [11 for CIC, 157 for IC and 173 for both posts of CIC and IC] were received by the last date. The number of applications for IC was 330.

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11. Meanwhile, the above-mentioned case was re-notified for hearing on 09.10.2015. After hearing the arguments, the Hon'ble Court in its order on 06.11.2015, in WP(C) 3386, gave the following directions:

(i) The selection process that had commenced vide Notifications dated 25.02.2014 and 16.07.2014 shall be finalized within six weeks from today and the three vacancies of Information Commissioners existing as of today shall be filled up from amongst the 553 applications that were received in response to the said two notifications.

(ii) The selection process pursuant to the circular dated 09.09.2015 shall be confined for selection and appointment of the Chief Information Commissioner in the vacancy that would arise w.e.f. 02.12.2015 and one Information Commissioner which is likely to arise w.e.f. 02.12.2015.

12. The Union of India challenged the order of Court on point (i) of para 11 above and comply with point (ii) of the said para. Accordingly, the Search Committee met on 10.11.2015 and 16.11.2015 and shortlisted three names for the post of Chief Information Commissioner and six names for the post of Information Commissioner. The six names of ICs were to be utilized in case the name of any exiting Information Commissioners was recommended by the Selection Committee for the post of Chief Information Commissioner which was likely to arise w.e.f. 2.12.2015.

13. In response to the notification dated 9.9.2015 and in pursuance of directions of Hon'ble High Court, the selection committee chaired by Prime Minister met on 11.12.2015 and 16.12.2015. Consequent to the recommendations of the selection committee, Government of India appointed Shri R.K. Mathur as Chief Information Commissioner on 04.01.2016.

14. As regards selection of ICs, pursuant to decision of Hon'ble High Court, the Govt. had challenged the verdict of High Court, Delhi by way of SLP No. 34495/2015 in the Supreme Court. The case was heard on 8.1.2016. The Hon'ble Supreme Court allowed Union of India six weeks' time, so as to enable it to fill up the remaining three vacancies of Information Commissioners, out of the candidates who had responded to the notifications dated 25.2.2014, 16.7.2014 and 9.9.2015.

15. Accordingly, the Search Committee under the Chairmanship of Cabinet Secretary met on 19.1.2016 and considered a total of 883 applications (553+330) and shortlisted candidates for the post of Information Commissioners keeping in view the record of proceedings of Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 8.1.2016. Minutes of the Search Committee are at **Flag 'A' [pages 736-740/c]**.

16. Meetings of the Selection Committee was held at 11.00 am on 19.02.2016. Agenda note of the meeting is at Flag 'B' [pages 623-815/c]. During the meeting the Committee perused the agenda including the details of the applicants along with their profile. Notwithstanding the short-listing done by the search committee, the Committee considered all eligible applicants who applied in response to advertisements made on 25.02.2014, 16.07.2014 and 09.09.2015 for the posts of Information Commissioner.

17. After taking into account all the relevant aspects, the Committee recommended the following persons for appointment as Information Commissioners in the Central Information Commission:-

(i) Shri Amitava Bhattacharya, IAS (Retd) (GJ:1980)

(iv)Shri Bimal Julka, IAS (Retd) (MP:1979)

(v) Shri Divya Prakash Sinha, IPS (Retd) (MT:1979)

At present, there are seven Information Commissioners and a Chief Information Commissioner.

2. As per Section 12 (5) of the Act, the Chief Information Commissioner and Information Commissioners shall be persons of eminence in public life with wide knowledge and experience in law, science and technology, social service, management, journalism, mass media or administration and governance.

3. Every Information Commissioner shall hold office for a term of five years from the date on which he enters upon his office or till he attains the age of sixty-five years, whichever is earlier, and shall not be eligible for reappointment as such Information Commissioner:

Provided that every Information Commissioner shall, on vacating his office under this sub-section be eligible for appointment as the Chief Information Commissioner in the manner specified in sub-section (3) of section 12.

4. According to sub-section (3) of Section 12 of the Act, the Chief Information Commissioner and the Information Commissioners shall be appointed by the President on the recommendation of a committee consisting of:

- i. the Prime Minister, who shall be the Chairperson of the committee;
- ii. the Leader of Opposition in the Lok Sabha ; and
- a Union Cabinet Minister to be nominated by the Prime Minister.

Explanation.—For the purposes of removal of doubts, it is hereby declared that where the Leader of Opposition in the House of the People has not been recognised as such, the Leader of the single largest group in opposition of the Government in the House of the People shall be deemed to be the Leader of Opposition.

5. Accordingly the Committee was constituted with the Prime Minister, as Chairperson, Shri Mallikarjun Kharge, Leader of the single largest Party in Opposition in the Lok Sabha and Shri Arun Jaitley, Minister of Finance.

6. Meetings of the Selection Committee was held at 11.00 am on 19.02.2016. Agenda note of the meeting is at Flag 'A' [1-286/c]. During the meeting the Committee perused the agenda including the details of the applicants along with their profile. Notwithstanding the short-listing done by the search committee, the Committee considered all eligible applicants who applied in response to advertisements made on 25.02.2014, 16.07.2014 and 09.09.2015 for the post of Information Commissioner.

7. After taking into account all the relevant aspects, the Committee recommended the following persons for appointment as Information Commissioners in the Central Information Commission:-

(i) Shri Amitava Bhattacharya, IAS (Retd) (GJ:1980)

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(ii) Shri Bimal Julka, IAS (Retd) (MP:1979)

(iii) Shri Divya Prakash Sinha, IPS (Retd) (MT:1979)
