

ANNUAL REPORT FY 2015-16

1. INTRODUCTION

The Civil Services Officers' Institute (CSOI) is a registered society under the Societies Registration Act 1903 and was set up in February 1998. CSOI was allotted a building at K.G. Marg, M.S. Apartments complex in 1998 which was later re-appropriated by CPWD to provide facilities of an Institute. Subsequently, land was allotted to CSOI in 2002 at Vinay Marg, Chanakyapuri measuring 4.23 acres by Ministry of Urban Development, Government of India. The new building was constructed by NBCC at a cost of Rs. 44.33 crore and it became operational with effect from December 2012. The Governing Council of CSOI took a decision to run both the Institutes at their respective locations in view of increased membership.

2. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

The aims and objectives of the CSOI inter alia include:-

- (i) To promote welfare of the officers of the Civil Services and bring them together in order to secure complete integration of the services and to build a corps of officers imbibed with the spirit of co-operation in all aspects of Civil Services.
- (ii) To hold, organise, arrange and conduct seminars, symposiums, talks, debates, workshops, lectures and other means of dispensing education to meet the needs and challenges of modern day Civil Administration.
- (iii) To print and publish journals, periodicals and manuals to keep the civil servants abreast with modern day developments in Civil Administration.
- (iv) To acquire and promote modern skills of Civil Administration and harmonize between the different fields of Civil Administration by disseminating or exchanging knowledge thereof and by providing such other facilities as would lead to their Universal application.
- (v) To establish and maintain libraries and information system to facilitate study of Civil Administration at International level and spreading information in regard thereto.

(vi) To organise and maintain, on no-profit-no-loss basis, limited residential accommodation, for the members of the Society coming to participate in the activities of the Association and of other bodies with cognate objectives, as well as non-members, invited to participate in the activities of the Association.

3. MANAGEMENT

CSOI is managed by a Governing Council headed by the Cabinet Secretary, an Executive Committee headed by the Secretary, Department of Personnel and Training and a Working Committee headed by Additional Secretary, Department of Personnel and Training. Various sub committees comprising of members assist Working Committee in its day to day smooth functioning, viz.,

- a) Finance sub committee
- Food & Beverages sub committee
- c) Event & Art sub committee
- d) Building Maintenance sub committee
- e) IT sub committee
- f) Library sub committee
- g) Sports sub committee

4. ACTIVITIES DURING THE YEAR 2015-16

During the year, CSOI organized various activities/events for welfare, entertainment and intellectual awareness on public issues. All major festivals like Holi, Diwali, X-Mas and New Year were celebrated. National awardee artists were invited to perform dance and music concerts. CSOI also organized health talk, yoga camps, cancer detection camp and talks on self-actualization post retirement. Broad activities covered were:-

- Yoga & Body fit classes, children summer adventure camp, leadership workshop for undergraduates.

- Film Festivals to screen selected Panorama of Indian classical films National Awarded Films & Latest popular Hindi Cinema & Documentaries.

- Tie up with United Services Institution of India for organising guest lectures on National and International topics of concern.

5. FACILITIES OF NEW CSOI BUILDING AT VINAY MARG, CHANAKYAPURI, NEW DELHI

The new CSOI has been designed to provide multiple facilities for its members. It has two multi cuisine restaurants, a Bar, Lounge, Coffee Shop, Auditorium with 250 seating capacity, two air conditioned party halls for 150 guests, two open terraces for open air parties, ten fully furnished guest rooms, gymnasium, health club with spa for both ladies and men separately, Shahnaz Beauty Parlour for both men and women, swimming pool, squash court, Table Tennis, Billiard Room, Card Room, TV & kids room. The tariff structure for various facilities has been approved by the Executive Committee and is posted on CSOI website.

6. FINANCES

CSOI has generated a net surplus of Rs. 7.33 crore in the year 2015-16 & its major investment portfolio is in the form of Fixed Deposits with public sector banks. As it was conveyed in the last AGM, there was a case of financial embezzlement of Rs. 39.18 lakhs by an account clerk, which has been fully recovered from the employee. The management of CSOI also decided to get investigative audit carried out by another CA firm empaneled with CAG. Two interim reports have been received from the CA firm. As per these reports, one fraudulent

entry of Rs. 13,000/- has been brought to light. The entire transactions of the FY 2014-2015 are being checked and final report from the investigative Auditor is awaited.

Without prejudice to above, CSOI management has already introduced strict internal controls to avoid such incidents in future, as mentioned in the Annual report of 2014-15.

These internal controls are being followed sincerely. Further, the accounts branch of CSOI has been fully augmented by filling up all the vacancies. It has also been decided that in future statement of accounts and balance confirmation would be taken from all the vendors at the end of each financial year.

8. OVERALL ASSESSMENT OF PERFORMANCE

During the financial year 2015-16, CSOI has substantially grown in its stature by enrolling ten thousand members and with increase in its investment portfolio in fixed deposits with public sector banks and bonds from Rs.39.34 Cr. to Rs.45.59 Cr. and booked a net surplus of Rs.7.33 Cr.

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Civil Services Officers Institute, which comprises the Balance Sheet as at 31st March,2016 and Income & Expenditure Account for the year ended on that date along with schedules thereto.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

The management of the Institute is responsible with respect to the preparation of these financial statements that give a true and fair view of the financial position, financial performances of the Institute in accordance with accounting principle generally accepted in India.

This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records for safe guarding of the assets of the Institute and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting polices; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to preparation and presentation of financial statements that give a true and fair view and free from material mis-statements, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these Financial Statements based on our audit. We have taken into account, the accounting and auditing standards and included in our audit report. These Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatements. We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our opinion on consolidated financial statements.

Emphasis of matter

 During the FY 2015-16, a embezzlement of Rs. 39,18,594 on CSOI was detected by management of CSOI. Subsequently entire amount had been recovered from that employee during the FY 2015-16. Year wise bifurcation of total amount involved is as under:

Amount pertaining to FY 2014-15 and FY 2015-16 has been accounted for in the respective year's account. Since the accounts for the financial year from 2011-12 to 2013-14 has already been closed, the amount of Rs. 19,99,139/-recovered against these years is treated as income of the FY 2015-16.

During FY-2014-15 unrecoverable TDS refund amounting to Rs. 27,05,394 pertaining to the earlier
periods has been written off. Now Management is of the view that these amounts are recoverable
hence reinstated in the books of account. CSOI is perusing this matter with the Income tax department
and initiated the process of claim for refund.

We further report that:-

- We have obtained all the information and the explanation which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purpose of our audit;
- In our opinion proper books of account as required by law have been maintained by the Society so far appears from our examination of the books;
- iii) The Balance Sheet and the Income & Expenditure Account dealt with by this report are in agreement with the books of account:
- In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanation given to us, the said accounts read together with the Accounting Policies as mentioned in Schedule 16 thereon give a true & fair view;
 - In the case of the Balance Sheet of the State of Affairs of the Society as at 31st March 2016;
 - In the case of Income & Expenditure Account of the excess of Income over Expenditure for the year ended on that date.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES & NOTES FORMING PART OF THE ACCOUNTS

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Accounting:

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, on accrual basis, in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles and to comply with the applicable accounting standards except annual subscription received from the members. The accounting policies have been consistently applied by the Institute unless otherwise stated.

Fixed Assets:

- a) Fixed assets are stated at cost of acquisition / construction less accumulated depreciation.
 Cost includes purchase price and all other costs attributable of bringing the assets to the working condition for intended use.
- b) Expenses attributable to fixed assets are added to the cost of assets if it increases the capacity/ performance of the assets as compared to assessed earlier.

Depreciation

Depreciation on fixed assets is computed according to Written Down Value (WDV) Method based on depreciation rates as provided in the Income Tax Act, 1961, except the office equipments, which are classified under the head Furniture & Fixture and the rate applicable thereto, is charged.

4. Grant in Aid

Grant received from Government of India for acquiring fixed assets is accounted as 'Capital Grants in Aid' and shown in the liability side. The depreciation charged on the assets funded out the grant in aid is reduced from the cost of assets as well as from the Capital Grant in Aid.

Inventories

- a) Inventory comprising of Liquor and Beverages are valued at cost or net realizable value, whichever, is lower. The cost of inventories is determined on First in First out (FIFO) basis.
- Value of closing stock is taken as certified by the Management.

Revenue Recognition

Revenue is recognized as under -

- a) Revenue has been recognized at the time of sale or rendering of services. However, if at the time of sale or rendering of services there is significant uncertainty in ultimate collection of the revenue, then revenue recognition is postponed and in such cases revenue is recognized only when it becomes reasonably certain that ultimate collection will be made.
- Subscription received from life time members has been amortized over a period of 20 years based on the estimated remaining average life of members.
- Return on investments is recognized on a time proportion basis.

Investments

Institute's surplus funds as on 31.03.2016 are in Fixed Deposits with Banks and Bonds and the same are carried on at cost.

Employees' retirement benefits

 a) Gratuity liability due to the employees has been measured giving due consideration to eligibility /entitlements of each employee and the provision thereof has been made based on management estimate. Employer's contribution towards Provident Fund and ESI is charged to the Income and Expenditure Account.

NOTES FORMING PART OF ACCOUNTS

- The title deed of the land, at Vinay Marg, Chankayapuri is in process of evaluation by Ministry of Urban & Development.
- 10. As per Accounting Standard 12 issued by Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, the depreciation chargeable on the assets purchased out of grant amount is required to be reduced from the cost of assets as well as from the grant in aid received. During the year, depreciation of Rs. 3,68,18,041/chargeable for the assets purchased out of grant has been reduced from the Grant in Aid as well as from the block of assets. The W.D.V. of the assets purchased out of Grant In aid as on 31st March 2016 is Rs. 33,18,66,130/-which has been reconciled with the cumulative amount of Grant in Aid received (after adjusting for depreciation).
- Income of Institute is exempted u/s 12A of the Income Tax Act, 1961 and hence no provision for Income Tax is required.
- 12. During FY-2014-15 unrecoverable TDS refund amounting to Rs. 27,05,394 pertaining to the earlier periods has been written off. Now Management is of the view that these amounts are recoverable hence reinstated in the books of account. CSOI is perusing this matter with the Income tax department and initiated the process of claim for refund.
- During the FY 2015-16, a embezzlement of Rs. 39,18,594 on CSOI was detected by management of CSOI. Subsequently entire amount had been recovered from that employee during the FY 2015-16. Year wise bifurcation of total amount involved is as under:

Amount pertaining to FY 2014-15 and FY 2015-16 has been accounted for in the respective year's account. Since the accounts for the financial year from 2011-12 to 2013-14 has already been closed, the amount of Rs. 19,99,139/-recovered against these years is treated as income of the FY 2015-16.

- Balance outstanding with parties as members, vendors and advances are subject to the reconciliation from the respective parties.
- Previous year's figures have been regrouped / rearranged wherever necessary in order to correspond with current year's figures.
- Figures in the balance sheet, Income & Expenditure account and schedules thereon have been rounded off to the nearest rupee.
